ACADEMIC CALENDAR

SPRING SEMESTER 2020

Classes: late January - late June
Exams period: mid-May - late June

AUTUMN SEMESTER 2019

Classes: late August - late January
Exams period: mid-December - late January

AU INTRO DAYS are mandatory for all exchange students

Spring semester: late January/early February

Autumn semester: late August/early September

Please note NEW nomination and application deadlines:

Spring semester:

Nomination period: 15 August – 15 September
Application period: 1 September – 1 October

Autumn semester:

Nomination period: 15 February – 15 March
Application period: 1 March – 1 April

Housing application deadlines are the same as above.

PARTNER NOMINATION PROCESS

Students must be nominated by their home university. Please submit the *Nominations for exchange to AU* spreadsheet by the nomination deadline.

Students will receive account activation and application information via email from AU.

ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS

Application: Students apply for admission and AU Housing via AU's application portal.

Admission: Applications are processed on an ongoing basis. Students can their access letter of enrollment immediately upon admission.

Residence permit application: if required, students will receive a residence permit application form immediately upon admission. Students are advised to submit their application as soon as possible. More information is available [here](#).

Application for courses: once admitted, students will receive instructions for applying for courses

Housing offer: housing offers will be sent to successful applicants by 15 December (Spring term) and 1 July (Autumn term). Housing offers must be accepted within 48 hours.

Arrival information: students will receive pre-arrival information and mentor/buddy contact information, if applicable, by email

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Exchange students at AU are expected to have English language qualifications comparable to TOEFL test results of 83 (ibt) or a score of 6.5 in the IELTS

Most applicants are not required to provide documentation for language proficiency; some applicants within the Faculty of Science and Technology, the Faculty of Arts (English Degree Programme only) and all applicant to Faculty of Health must provide language documentation.

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

Transcript of academic records are automatically sent by email approximately two months after the end of exams.

Students do not have to submit individual requests for transcripts.

ECTS AND MARKS

Course workload is expressed in ECTS.

Full-time study is equivalent to 30 ECTS per semester.

Danish marks and corresponding ECTS marks are as follows:

12 is the highest mark, 02 is the minimum passing mark.

Health Insurance

Students staying for more than 3 months are covered by Danish Health Insurance after having received a CPR-number. (application upon arrival – See Useful Links for information)

Students staying less than 3 months must obtain private health insurance before arriving in Denmark.

Third Party Liability Insurance

It is the student's responsibility to carry insurance covering travel, personal belongings, accidents and third party liability while studying in Denmark.

Aarhus University does not cover any losses that may occur, and strongly recommends that students arrange insurance before travelling.
